A Lesson of Three C's

- Conscience must be fully trained with integrity and followed.
- Character is the code and traits that define and govern you.
- **Conduct** is what you actually put into practice from the above.
- <u>Duty</u> is what you do; <u>honor</u> is how; <u>sacrifice</u> is what you will pay.
- It is not perfection (no one is perfect), but it never gives up.
- With God on his side ... this man will do exploits (Dan 11:32).

- They would not compromise any duty of Bible Christianity.
- They could have saved their lives by simply giving on a point.
- They laid down their lives with cheer, faith, and hope ruling.
- They copied their Lord and Savior by forgiving their enemies.
- They sacrificed the loss of all earthly assets, persons, and of life.
- They made a choice that doing things God's way was crucial.

Other Great Bible Examples

- Joseph must be near the top for his character throughout life.
- Daniel must be near the top for his character throughout life.
- Moses was viewed by God as faithful in all His house (Heb 3:2).
- Caleb, Joshua, Samuel, and others resisted sinful compromise.
- Paul honored his duty to Christ with great sacrifice of his life.
- Jesus kept all duties, honored His Father, and gave His life.

Joseph

- Out of <u>duty</u>, he told his father about his brothers, regardless.
- Out of <u>duty</u>, he scorned his boss's wife and risked all for God.
- Out of honor, he never rebelled in prison or anywhere else.
- Out of <u>honor</u>, he forgave his brothers entirely and quickly.
- <u>Sacrificially</u>, he flushed all bitterness and pride related to them.
- <u>Sacrificially</u>, he never complained or whined about his losses.

Daniel

- Out of <u>duty</u>, Daniel rejected Babylon's food rules to obey God.
- Out of <u>duty</u>, Daniel's three friends rejected universal religion.
- Out of honor, Daniel turned down Belshazzar's rich rewards.
- Out of honor, Daniel confessed his nation's sins like no other.
- <u>Sacrificially</u>, he would rather keep praying than save his life.
- <u>Sacrificially</u>, he denied himself good food three weeks to pray.

Duty, Honor, Sacrifice of Soldiers

• **DUTY:** Obey without question or compromise and with total loyalty and faith the officers over you and military regulations.

• HONOR: Conduct yourself at all times whether by regulation or not with nobility consistent with America's highest values.

• SACRIFICE: Be willing to do anything asked of you and when you can do no more to find more to do even to lose your life.

Duty, Honor, Sacrifice of Christians

• **DUTY:** Obey all the commandments and principles of the Bible with reverent fear of God and specified love of others.

• HONOR: Conduct yourself nobly as a child of God with holy desire for His glory and to grow in favor with God and men.

• SACRIFICE: Willingly give up anything for Him, His cause, and His children with cheerful reflection of Jesus Christ's sacrifices.

DUTY Defined

- Fear God and keep His commandments is your duty (Ec 12:13).
- Duty rejects emotions and feelings for Bible law and principle.
- Everything must be brought back to the Bible in all your life.
- Everything should be done for and with, As the LORD liveth.
- Your wife and children know they can always <u>count</u> on you.
- If you perfectly obey, you are still an unprofitable servant.

HONOR Defined

- Think, speak, and act like a prince, as did Araunah (II Sa 24:23).
- Pilate did not have much or any by his treatment of Jesus.
- It is being zealously affected always in a good thing (Gal 4:18).
- Your wife and children are <u>surprised</u> by your thoughtfulness.
- It is more being a gentleman (honor) than being a man (duty).
- David poured out water of Bethlehem in an honorable display.

HONOR Defined

- Lance stopped to let his top competitor, Jan Ulrich, remount.
- David's conduct toward Saul in spite of hate and opportunity.
- The sons of Zeruiah were zealous, but lacked honor like David.
- Honor is beyond the call of duty to be extra noble and classy.
- It is constantly thinking of a good reputation ... <u>three names</u>!
- There is no room in honor for any folly, or dead flies (Eccl 10:1).

HONOR Defined

- It is David paying for the temple when he could not build it!
- Bereans were nobler than others for reception of the gospel.
- It is enthusiastic zeal in duties rather than perfunctory efforts.
- There is no honor in foolish talking or jesting. Be sober.
- Forgiveness and mercy beyond normal show great honor.
- Class is not costly or fake; it is graciousness and temperance.

SACRIFICE Defined

- It is the reasonable sacrifice to give things up for God (Ro 12:1).
- David would not let Araunah pay for his sacrifice (II Sam 24:24).
- You must count the cost and pay it to be Christ's (Luk 14:25-33).
- Losing your life for His sake is only way to find it (Matt 16:25).
- It is swearing to your hurt and paying a vow anyway (Ps 15:4).
- Paul counted all things in his life as dung and loss (Phil 3:8).

DUTY Applied

- Your walk with God as a joyful example of Christianity (Ge 18:19).
- Set rules for real modesty, check regularly, and enforce them.
- It is your duty to initiate and lead marital and family devotions.
- You must train children socially, professionally, financially, etc.
- Provide for your family's future if anything happened to you.
- A transferable skill and financial savings are not suggestions.

HONOR Applied

- It is the difference of obeying your parents or honoring them.
- It is attending church to participate, not to vegetate in a pew.
- It is seeking out uncomely members and giving them honor.
- It is going to those offended rather than confronting offenders.
- Talk less; take backseat; never presume; ask instead of answer.
- It is maxing the grace of lips while glorying in passing over!

HONOR Applied

- It is knowing and showing that giving is better than receiving.
- It is giving to those who cannot return the deed (Lu 14:12-14).
- It is commending and praising others at any opportunity.
- Never complaining ... but always thanking ... for everything.
- It is practicing the most graciousness with those closest to you.
- It classifies every offence as 100 pence or less ... and forgives!

SACRIFICE Applied

- Give up your home, schedule, time, comfort to help others.
- Give up your pride to forgive an offender and flush bitterness.
- Give up money (if you have it) to be liberal (Pr 11:25; Isaiah 32:8).
- Give up honor; we are at best unprofitable servants (Lu 17:10).
- Give up your right eye or right hand to increase your holiness.
- Reorder your life in any way necessary for godly priorities.

Marriage

- <u>Duty</u> to passionately love without bitterness (Pr 5:19; Col 3:19).
- <u>Duty</u> to rule spirit, communicate, cherish, and nourish her.
- Honor is to remember her weakness and adjust for it (I Pe 3:7).
- <u>Honor</u> is to search and discern her heart rather than words.
- <u>Sacrifice</u> your fantasies/habits for giving her due benevolence.
- <u>Sacrifice</u> her being away and your time, friends, money, pride.

Marriage

- Know to give your wife enough money for food, clothes, etc.
- Wives and children are weaker and need your mercy (I Pet 3:7).
- Quality time is ... guess what ... time dedicated to her only.
- Your wife wants to know what you think, do, and are planning.
- Listening to your wife and taking her to a place of her choice.
- Forgive your wife ... trust your wife ... apologize to your wife.

Fathers

- <u>Duty</u> to teach them God's will and enforce it in their lives.
- <u>Duty</u> to teach them practical wisdom for professional success.
- <u>Honor</u> is an affectionate and personal relationship with them.
- <u>Honor</u> by commendation, liberty, and praise for good behavior.
- <u>Sacrifice</u> by getting out of your comfort zone and taking time.
- <u>Sacrifice</u> by allowing them some liberties from your choices.

Relationships

- Do you remember the relationship wheel with all your duties?
- Does your <u>conscience</u>, <u>character</u>, <u>conduct</u> prove you are third?
- Do you sincerely care about others and pursue them for them?
- Do you more freely and fully forgive others than they do you?
- Are you a peacemaker even to the point of suffering fraud?
- Do you love mercy? Love serving? Love listening?

Inputs

- Sacrifice will be involved to flush some and revive others.
- You cannot grow and be a prince without the right inputs.
- You will get weaker and be a castaway if you allow bad ones.
- Think music, movies, television, Internet, porn, games, friends.
- Think Bible, prayer, music, sermons, godly friends, meditation.
- Show your toughness to God, your family, and all others.

Personal Life

- Does your personal appearance reflect Christian character?
- Is your house well-kept and organized for easy entertaining?
- Does your vehicle reflect care and honor proper for Christians?
- You think clothes too carnal? Do soldiers wear just anything?
- Do you have the discipline to deny spending for savings?
- Do you have the discipline to deny friends for reaching out?





Conclusion

- Soldiers of the world's militaries use duty, honor, and country.
- We have a far better nation deserving better duty and honor.
- Our Commander-in-chief is the LORD God and Jesus Christ.
- They will study and train until they are perfectly fit soldiers.
