There Is No Book Like the Bible

God wrote the Bible – crushing all other books.

It is pure truth for every aspect of life and conduct.

Every child of God needs His words to grow (Luke 4:4).

The spiritual new man is fed by the spiritual words.

Truth and wisdom for real success are only found in it.



There Are Benefits of Reading It

The benefits are great and many without question.

• The Bible itself ... testimonies ... experience prove it.

It makes average men great, and great men greater.

You cannot survive and will not succeed without it.

This study is concerned with how to read, not why.



Attitude

It is the flesh – God's enemy – that does not like it.

The Bible is God's personal, helpful love letter to you.

The Bible is a divine library of everything you need.

Reading must be a habit, but it cannot be a burden.

God exalted His word, so be excited and passionate.



Humility

A large part of attitude is humility, which God loves.

Remember how Solomon got God's great blessings.

God hides truth from the proud and gives it to babes.

Admit you are nothing and all your thoughts are vain.

Beg for wisdom; confess ignorance; pledge obedience.



Prayer

It is God's book – He can teach you or blind you.

Wise men beg God for Him to open it (Ps 119:18; Pr 2:3).

You need the Spirit of wisdom and revelation (Ep 1:17).

God has promised liberal wisdom for asking (Jas 1:5).

You should pray before, during, and after reading.



Habit

If you do not establish a habit, it will not happen.

Morning is likely better – rested and not distracted.

Alone is likely better – not near others who distract.

It should be a lifelong habit for you and your family.

Do not let the habit cancel the fact it is a meeting!



Inputs

The Bible should be your most important input.

Playing with other inputs will defeat Bible reading.

Do not confuse yourself with godly <u>and</u> carnal inputs.

God will know exactly how little you love His words.

The world hates God's words along with your flesh.



Program

The simplest is the one-chapter-a-day program.

If too easy, read two a day – Bible twice in a year!

Three a day and five on Sunday is the whole Bible.

Some include a Psalm and/or Proverb each day.

The One-Year Bible or Daily Light can lose context.



Intake

Exegesis is finding or taking truth from the passage.

Eisegesis is putting your own ideas into the passage.

Let God speak to you, rather than you spin His word.

Do not read our doctrine into a passage unless there.

Seek God's wisdom, not to discover yourself (Pr 18:1-2).



Focus


How you read is more important than how much.

Read prayerfully, and alert, and for comprehension.

Seek meaning and intent, not just words or sounds.

Apply the lesson to you and how it affects your life.

Consider the words and sentences as crucial truth.



Obey


• The Bible is God's word - do not play with Him.

He wants obedience to what you learn (Jas 1:22-25).

• If you disobey, He will close the Bible to you (Jn 7:17).

· If you disobey, He will chasten you for presumption.

Reading alone is damning ... just ask the Pharisees.



Helpful Questions (1)

· Who, whom, what, why, when, where for context.

Two-steps: (1) it cannot mean ... (2) it must mean.

What doctrine of truth is being taught here?

Is Jesus Christ revealed in this passage?

What example has been given for me to follow?



Helpful Questions (2)


What sin has been identified for me to avoid?

Is there a prayer in the passage I can pray?

Is there a promise I can claim?

What comfort should I derive?

What duty should I perform?



Take Away


Take away at least one key idea from each reading.

If you share or talk with others, it will stay longer.

If you ask yourself later about it, it will stay longer.

Thank God later in the day for giving you His word.

Recall later the place and its position in the whole.



Technology


Technology is ok, but a printed Bible might be better.

Cell phones or iPads may not be conducive as Bible.

Letting Scourby read while you drive may not cut it.

But these devices can work at times for more Bible.

Bible software or the Internet allow quick answers.



Meditation


• Meditative reading is key (Josh 1:7-8; Ps 1:1-3; 119:97-99).

It is deep, slow, focused consideration of all angles.

It is this process that feeds your spirit by the Spirit.

Pray the passage or about the passage to God.

If you have to read less to do this, that is fine.



Memorization


It hides God's words in your heart in a unique way.

You can think about God's words away from Bible.

• It puts the words of truth in your mouth (Pr 22:17-21).

It teaches the importance of every individual word.

It is great material for "daydreaming" or sleeping.



Exhorting

Encourage each other by texts and other means.

Share your reading pleasure/profit to provoke others.

Ask others if they have found anything good lately.

Refer to a Bible verse in every conversation you can.

Apply the Bible to every issue you discuss with saints.



Time

Do you complain you do not have time to read?

Then you are too busy and need to adjust your life.

You always make time for whatever you want to do.

There are 168 hours a week ... 1440 minutes a day.

Does God deserve 1% of a day, 15 mins? 2%? 3%?



Tools


These slides are about reading the Bible, not study.

Hermeneutics or advanced tools do not fit here.

Basic tools are helpful and stop discouragement.

Use Bible dictionary, handbook, concise commentary.

Other basic tools are concordance, Naves, TSK, etc.



Technical

Study Bibles confuse, mixing God's and man's words.

Get answers from good commentaries or pastor.

It is a spiritual book – prayer is more key than tools.

Hermeneutics is different ... reading is to meet God.

Remember spiritual qualifications over study rules.



Other Ideas

· Underlining or highlighting can mark words or verses.

- Drawing lines or cross-references get you involved.
- A journal of your daily findings can be excellent.
- Margin notes can make your Bible like a journal.
- E-Bibles allow you to attach your notes to verses.



Conclusion


• Your life is racing away ... Bible reading slows it down.
