Boasting About God ...

could be you boasting about Him ...

or God boasting about Himself.

My soul shall make her boast in the LORD: the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad.

Psalm 34:2

In God we boast all the day long, and praise thy name for ever. Selah.

Psalm 44:8

Boasting about God is not sin. It is praise and worship. The Bible exhorts us to it!

Boasting about yourself is not sin, <u>if</u> true, <u>if</u> by God, and <u>if</u> for a godly reason. Both David and Paul did.

For <u>by thee</u> I have run through a troop; and <u>by my God</u> have I leaped over a wall.

Psalm 18:29

But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.

I Corinthians 15:10

If you do not delight in God like David and others did, then this study will bore you.

Delighting in God ... boasting about Him to yourself, others, and Him ... is something He loves and is life's greatest pleasure.

One way to measure your love of God is to see how excited you get when you read Him boasting about His greatness!

Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.

Psalm 37:4

- 23 Thus saith the LORD, Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches:

We know Job was real; Ezekiel and and James used him alongside known Bible heroes.

James 5:10-11

We cannot prove where Job lived, but it does not affect interpretation.

We assume by several factors that he lived between 2500 and 1500 B.C.

This is after the Flood and before Moses.

Elihu admonished Job to submit to God.
Then God humbled Job by His greatness.
God rewarded Job in the end for patience.

God chose in four chapters to emphasize His creative power and wisdom, not His prophetic ability as He did in Isaiah 40-48. Creation is the first source of revelation of the glory, eternal power, and Godhead of the only living and true God, Jehovah. The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork.

Psalm 19:1

For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, <u>even his</u> <u>eternal power and Godhead</u>; so that they are without excuse:

Romans 1:20

Who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen.

Romans 1:25

- 21 Hear now this, O foolish people, and without understanding; which have eyes, and see not; which have ears, and hear not:

This is the only wise God debating His infinite superiority with the wisest man on earth.

Who is this that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge?

Your words are nonsense. Who do you think you are?

Where wast thou when I laid the foundations of the earth? declare, if thou hast understanding.

In the beginning was me; I do not recall seeing you.

Who hath laid the measures thereof, if thou knowest? or who hath stretched the line upon it?

Who designed, measured, and built your earth? I did.

Whereupon are <u>the foundations</u> thereof fastened? or who laid <u>the corner stone</u> thereof;







What foundation does the earth have! Or cornerstone!

Note as we start that God began with ... who? ... where? ... who?

He put Job down where he belonged, inferior in person and performance.

- 8 Or who shut up the sea with doors, when it brake forth, as if it had issued out of the womb?
- 9 When I made the cloud the garment thereof, and thick darkness a swaddlingband for it,
- 10 And brake up for it my decreed place, and set bars and doors,
- 11 And said, Hitherto shalt thou come, but no further: and here shall thy proud waves be stayed?

Job 38:8-11












Who made and controls the sea like an infant? I do!





5) TRENCHES

- Deepest feature of the ocean, plunging deep below the seafloor.
- Trenches are long, narrow, canyon like structures, most often found next to a continental margin.
- They occur much more commonly in the Pacific than in any of the other oceans.
- The deepest trench on Earth is the Mariana Trench, which runs from the coast of Japan south and then west toward the Philippine Islands—a distance of about 1,580 miles.
- The British naval vessel, Challenger II surveyed the trench in 1951 and named the deepest part of the trench, the "Challenger Deep".



Oxen are less than 2000 lb.; 10,000 lb. rhino is better!

Gavest thou the goodly wings unto the peacocks? or wings and feathers unto the ostrich?

Job 39:13



Commentators are as confounded here as anywhere in the Bible, for they want it to read ostriches and storks!

Their confusion should be no deterrent to wings and peacocks, for these words are better than their Legion of guesses.



Observations to Trust the KJV for Goodly Wings of Peacocks

- 1. We start with total faith in the KJV and its individual words without question or reservation (here, here, here).
- 2. Modern Bibles contradict each other with wild corruptions, proving ignorant of the text and context (here).
- 3. Peacocks were clearly known to both Tyre's merchants and the Jews in king Solomon's day (I Kings 10:22).
- 4. Peacocks have a notable feather feature, which we usually call its tail, thought it may look like a big wing.
- 5. The plural wings of plural peacocks differs from the plural wings of the singular, collective noun ostrich, thus allowing one wing (or tail) for a single peacock but requiring two wings for each and every ostrich.
- 6. The brief mention of peacocks is like that for raven, grasshopper, horse, hawk, arm (38:41; 39:18,20,26; 40:9).
- 7. Synecdoche, a part for the whole e.g. *all hands on deck* (meaning sailors), thus wings for bird and its tail.
- 8. <u>Metonymy</u>, a connection e.g. way to use your head (brain in head), thus wings for the goodly tail feathers.
- 9. <u>Euphemism</u>, a polite connection e.g. *thigh* for genitals (in the Bible), thus wings instead of negative tail.
- 10. <u>Metaphor</u>, comparing similar things e.g. *rivers of waters run down mine eyes*, thus wings for a tail wing.
- 11. <u>Irony</u>, using word(s) with opposite intent e.g. *How glorious was the king of Israel to day*, for God boasts of the wings of both birds, but neither has notable wings (the identifier of birds), though both have other notable features (the tail of a peacock and running speed of an ostrich), with peacock wings not goodly and ostrich wings not functional, respectively. Ostrich feathers are unlike other bird's, not used for flying.
- 12. Other English versions e.g. Bishops Bible (1568) and Geneva Bible (1560/99) and other language Bibles e.g. Spanish Sagradas Escrituras (1569) and Italian Diodati (1603) had wings and peacocks before the KJV.

- 13 Gavest thou the goodly wings unto the peacocks? or wings and feathers unto the ostrich?
- 14 Which leaveth her eggs in the earth, and warmeth them in dust,
- 15 And forgetteth that the foot may crush them, or that the wild beast may break them.
- 16 She is hardened against her young ones, as though they were not hers: her labour is in vain without fear;
- 17 Because God hath deprived her of wisdom, neither hath he imparted to her understanding.
- 18 What time she lifteth up herself on high, she scorneth the horse and his rider.







God deprived the ostrich of wisdom, so that she kills her young like today's abortionists!

Lamentations 4:3





Which is fastest, horse or ostrich?

Not very close!

Horse about 35!

Ostrich about 43!

God boasts ...

See my birds! I gave them wings, to little or no profit!

- 19 <u>Hast thou given the horse strength</u>? hast thou clothed his neck with thunder?
- 20 Canst thou make him afraid as a grasshopper? the glory of his nostrils is terrible.

God loves horses, and He made Secretariat special! Secretariat won the 1973 Belmont Stakes by 31 lengths, with a time that is still the record for 1.5 miles on dirt, destroying his main competitor Sham, who finished last.

God gave Secretariat a heart that was 2.5 times that of the average horse, a powerful engine for racing.

God boasts ...

Horses are special, but who made them special? I did!

- 27 <u>Doth the eagle mount up at thy command</u>, and make her nest on high?
- 28 She dwelleth and abideth on the rock, upon the crag of the rock, and the strong place.
- 29 From thence she seeketh the prey, and her eyes behold afar off.
- 30 Her young ones also suck up blood: and where the slain are, there is she.

Job 39:27-30









An eagle's vision is 6 times or more better than human vision.

They can see a mouse at ¼ mile or a rabbit at 2 miles.

God boasts ...

Eagles are famous; I made all their special traits! You?

Our glorious and blessed God took an intermission here to confront Job!

- 1 Moreover the LORD answered Job, and said,
- 2 Shall he that contendeth with the Almighty instruct him? he that reproveth God, <u>let him answer it</u>.

- 3 Then Job answered the LORD, and said,
- 4 Behold, I am vile; what shall I answer thee? I will lay mine hand upon my mouth.
- 5 Once have I spoken; but I will not answer: yea, twice; but <u>I will</u> proceed no further.

But God would not let Job off so easily, so the wonderful lesson continued!

Hast thou an arm like God? or <u>canst thou thunder with a voice like</u> him?

180dB: Space shuttle lift-off

130dB: Jet engine at 100 ft.

120dB: Threshold of pain, Thunder

110dB: Rock music, Screaming child

100dB: Subway train, Blow dryer

90dB: Factory machinery at 3 ft.

80dB: Busy street, Alarm clock

70dB: Busy traffic, Phone ringtone

60dB : Normal conversation at 3 ft.

50dB: Quiet office, Quiet street

40dB: Quiet residential area, Park

30dB: Quiet whisper at 3 ft, Library

20dB: Rustling leaves, Ticking watch

Thunder is outside the threshold of pain, so that those who do know their God can enjoy it without flinching too badly or needing to cover ears.

God loves His thunder, so He had David write Psalm 29 about thunder!



- 14 Then will I also confess unto thee that thine own right hand can save thee.






Commentators guessed elephant or hippo.


Behemoth is not an elephant or hippo!

The elephant, hippopotamus, and rhinoceros do not have tails even close to being like a cedar tree.




Crocodiles certainly have tails like cedar trees and move them with great power, but they do not eat grass like an ox!

It hardly matters exactly what behemoth is, for the lesson is that God's greatest land creature is something He made and that ought to humble Job in meek submission.
















Do these dinosaurs have tails like a cedar?

God made behemoth with Job, so this huge creature and man coexisted.

Job lived between 2500 and 1500 B.C.

Behemoth might well be extinct now.

We should not limit it to known creatures.

God boasts ...

I made the biggest land creature living. Get down!

- 1 Canst thou draw out leviathan with an hook? or his tongue with a cord which thou lettest down?
- 2 Canst thou put an hook into his nose? or bore his jaw through with a thorn?
- 3 Will he make many supplications unto thee? will he speak soft words unto thee?
- 4 Will he make a covenant with thee? wilt thou take him for a servant for ever?
- 5 Wilt thou play with him as with a bird? or wilt thou bind him for thy maidens?

Leviathan is a sea creature that exceeds all the rest of God's creatures, including behemoth.

Job 41:33

33 Upon earth there is not his like, who is made without fear.

34 He beholdeth all high things: he is a king over all the children of pride.

Job 41:33

He cannot be a whale or a crocodile, because the stated features deny it.


It hardly matters exactly what leviathan is, for the lesson is that God's greatest water creature is something He made and should humble Job in meek submission.


