THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

When Jesus warned his disciples to "beware of the leaven of the Pharisees," he was speaking of the motive which guides one's conduct. Jesus said of the Pharisees, "but all their works they do to be seen of men" (Mt 23:5). We all struggle with the desire for man's approval, which, within proper bounds, is legitimate. When tempted to hide our religion when with irreligious people, and to act more religious than we really are when with religious friends, is hypocrisy. The supreme fact of life is our relationship with GOD. Let us keep Him in mind and check how our thoughts, desires, words and deeds rate in His sight. Did not our Lord foretell that every secret thing about us will be exposed and made known!

Whenever we catch ourselves hesitating to give a bold witness of being a Bible-believing follower of Jesus Christ, let us remember the words of our Lord: "Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do" (v 4). Many of Christ's disciples in the past have steadfastly gone to their deaths because they would not recant their faith or deny their Lord. We do not face such danger. But we can give a definite witness and testimony by word and deed to glorify our heavenly Father and his beloved Son. May our prayer be that we are never moved, for even a moment, by the fear of any man.

HELP:
