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Moving to the Small Context

# What was the first rule?

There are no contradictions in the Bible.

All verses are reconciled to fit the whole.

There can be no private interpretations.

The whole Bible teaches one body of truth.

We first get rid of what it does not mean.

#### We are slaves to <u>context</u>.

#### We must serve this master.

"I beat my wife last night."



I love being a slave to context, and I need you to also love it!



#### A text used out of context is a pretext!

# A text ... used out of <u>context</u> ... is a pretext.

## A Text out of Context Is a Pretext!

- **TEXT** ... is a word, clause, verse, paragraph to study!
- **CONTEXT** ... is information around it showing intent.
- OUT OF CONTEXT uses words against author's intent.
- **PRETEXT** is a false impression designed to hide truth.
- We find the context and doctrine of the whole Bible.
- Then and only then do we move to the small context.

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## A Text out of Context Is a Pretext!

- So we make the small context our second rule!
- All writings of all kinds require context for meaning.
- Words are worthless without context ... *spelling bee*.
- You do not like your words being used out of context.
- A verse outside its intent is a lie even from the Bible!
- The wrong verse for a true point is a step to heresy.

# What is context?

Context is surrounding information that tells us what an author means by individual words, sentences, or paragraphs within a passage. Without grasping the author's viewpoint and intent, we will face words and phraseology that we will confuse or corrupt.

**Every word in the Bible is part of a verse.** 

**Every verse is part of a paragraph.** 

**Every paragraph is part of a chapter.** 

**Every chapter is part of a book.** 

**Every book is part of a testament.** 

Each testament is part of the whole Bible.

# Which of the previous sentences was Rule #1?

We cannot and must not isolate single words and sentences.

Their setting determines their meaning – not the words that make them up!

Your own words have been used out of context.

A single word, sentence, or document was singled out and given a meaning that did not agree with all the words, expressions, tones, circumstances, audience, acts, or facts surrounding it!

You were offended! So is the Lord when we do it to Him by misusing His words in the Bible! Isolating individual words or verses is like giving an impression of a Rembrandt from looking at one square inch of it or Handel's MESSIAH by listening to a few bars of it. If you hear me say, "I beat my wife last night," please inquire further than the word "beat" and this one sentence to find out what I actually did to her!

We don't play monopoly, so it was HIIT, baby!

It could also have been ten other things! It is a shame and sin that much preaching today uses words and verses as mantras, mottos, or sound bites without regard to their context!

#### The Bible Says:

#### Judas: "went and hanged himself" (Matt 27:5).

#### Jesus: "Go, and do thou likewise" (Luke 10:37).

#### Jesus: "That thou doest, do quickly" (Jn 13:27).

#### Should we do it right now or later tonight?

### How Do I Remember Context?

- WHO? ... can solve heresies like Daniel 3:25.
- WHOM? ... can help Lev 10:9; Mark 16:15; Jas 5:20.
- WHAT? ... can help Luke 16:1-8; Daniel; Revelation.
- WHY? ... can help Mal 2:16; Matt 7:1; Luke 10:29-37.
- WHEN? ... for Mat 23:1-3; Act 2:40; 15:20; Rev 17:18.
- WHERE? ... for Acts 15:1-2; Hebrews; I Peter 5:13.

Heresies due to ignoring small context are Legion. The word of God in Hebrews 4:12 must be Jesus by the content and next 2 verses! For <u>the word of God</u> is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

Hebrews 4:12

13 Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in <u>his sight</u>: but all things are naked and opened unto <u>the eyes of him</u> with <u>whom</u> we have to do.

14 Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession.

Hebrews 4:13-14

## Shaking in Hag 2:6-7 is now long past by the temple in context!

6 For thus saith the LORD of hosts; Yet once, it is a little while, and I will shake the heavens, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry land;

7 And I will shake all nations, and the desire of all nations shall come: and <u>I will fill this</u> <u>house with glory</u>, saith the LORD of hosts.

Haggai 2:6-7

8 The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, saith the LORD of hosts.

9 <u>The glory of this latter house shall be</u> greater than of the former, saith the LORD of hosts: and in this place will I give peace, saith the LORD of hosts.

Haggai 2:8-9

"But I say unto you," in Matthew 5 is not against the law but against the scribes! But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire. Matthew 5:22 Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment: Matthew 5:21 Falling from grace in Galatians 5:4 is only from the knowledge of grace in context!

### Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; <u>ye</u> <u>are fallen from grace</u>.

### Christ is become of no effect unto you, <u>whosoever of you are justified by the law</u>; ye are fallen from grace.

**Galatians 5:4** 

The temples of God in I Cor 3:16 and 6:19 are different – church and physical body! 18 Flee fornication. Every sin that a man doeth is without the body; but he that committeth fornication sinneth against his own body. 19 What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? 20 For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

I Corinthians 6:18-20

- 14 If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward.
- 15 If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire.
- 16 Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?
  17 If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are.

I Corinthians 3:14-17

Greater glory is found by the small context. Words "more sure" take on greater value when compared to God's voice! We have also a <u>more sure word of prophecy</u>; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your hearts:

II Peter 1:19

Charity is greater when seen as more excellent than being an apostle. Paul used "therefore" and "Amen" to create useful divisions and focused emphasis. (Romans 12:1-2; Eph 4:1)

Pronouns and antecedents are related by small context.

# Thou through thy commandments hast made me wiser than mine enemies: for <u>they</u> are ever with me.

Psalm 119:98

35 And did eat up all the herbs in <u>their</u> land, and devoured the fruit of <u>their</u> ground.
36 He smote also all the firstborn in <u>their</u> land, the chief of all <u>their</u> strength.
37 He brought <u>them</u> forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among <u>their</u> tribes.

Psalm 105:35-37

85 The proud have digged pits for me, which are not after thy law.
86 All thy commandments are faithful: <u>they</u>

persecute me wrongfully; help thou me.

Strange uses of names / things are in the small context.

### For if <u>Jesus</u> had given them rest, then would he not afterward have spoken of another day.

Hebrews 4:8

### This is the generation of them that seek him, that seek thy face, <u>O Jacob</u>. Selah.

**Psalm 24:6** 

Afterward shall the children of Israel return, and seek the LORD their God, and <u>David</u> <u>their king</u>; and shall fear the LORD and his goodness in the latter days.

Hosea 3:5

Prophetic perspective is the verb tense of quoted matter. And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, <u>I will pour out of my Spirit upon</u> <u>all flesh</u>: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams:

Acts 2:17

After this I will return, and <u>will build again</u> <u>the tabernacle of David</u>, which is fallen down; and I will build again the ruins thereof, and I will set it up: Acts 15:16 Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, <u>Yet once more I</u> shake not the earth only, but also heaven.

Hebrews 12:26

Context sets grammar and word meanings. But woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass over judgment <u>and the love of God</u>: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.

Luke 11:42

#### Whoso findeth <u>a wife</u> findeth a good thing, and obtaineth favour of the LORD.

Proverbs 18:22

The sense of scripture needs the small context. Thou shalt not bring the hire of a whore, or <u>the price of a dog</u>, into the house of the LORD thy God for any vow: for even both these are abomination unto the LORD thy God.

**Deuteronomy 23:18** 

17 There shall be no whore of the daughters of Israel, <u>nor a sodomite</u> of the sons of Israel.

18 Thou shalt not bring the hire of a whore, or <u>the price of a dog</u>, into the house of the LORD thy God for any vow: for even both these are abomination unto the LORD thy God.

## I made a covenant with mine eyes; why then should I think upon a maid?

Job 31:1

9 If mine heart have been <u>deceived by a</u> <u>woman</u>, or if I have laid wait at my neighbour's door;

11 For this is an heinous crime; yea, it is an

### Praise him with the timbrel and dance: praise him with stringed instruments and <u>organs</u>.

## What about John 8:7?

So when they continued asking him, he lifted up himself, and said unto them, <u>He that is</u> <u>without sin among you</u>, let him first cast a stone at her.

John 8:7

It cannot mean what most everyone says it means by the large context of Rule #1.

It means without sin against due process for capital punishment by who, whom, when, and why of the small context of Rule #2.

So when they continued asking him, he lifted up himself, and said unto them, <u>He that is</u> <u>without sin among you</u> *IN THIS LEGAL MATTER*, let him first cast a stone at her. John 8:7 So when they continued asking him, he lifted up himself, and said unto them, <u>He that is</u> <u>without sin among you</u> *IN THIS CAPITAL CHARGE*, let him first cast a stone at her. John 8:7

## What about John 9:3?

#### Jesus answered, <u>Neither hath this man</u> <u>sinned, nor his parents</u>: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him. John 9:3

It cannot mean what it sounds like it means by the large context of Rule #1. It means the man born blind was not born that way due to his sins or his parents' sins. 2 And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, <u>that he was born blind</u>?

**3** Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him.

We first get rid of what a verse does not mean. We then find what it does mean by rules like context.

#### We Are Bible Christians ... Four Ways!

We believe what it claims about its inspiration!

We believe 66 books of the KJV by <u>canonicity</u>!

We believe word-level truth by preservation.

We give the sense by its rules of *interpretation*.
