Why David and Goliath Tonight?

We are studying the Davidic covenant; you read I Samuel 17 last Saturday night; we want to know David to know greatness.

The event of David and Goliath is entirely recorded in one chapter.

I Samuel 17 has 58 verses, and they are all dedicated to the context and facts of this event.

Outline of I Samuel 17

- 1-11 ... Israel and Philistines go to war ... Goliath challenges Israel.
- 12-27 ... Jesse sends David to brothers ... he is willing to face Goliath.
- 28-39 ... Eliab makes fun of little brother ... Saul permits him to fight.
- 40-44 ... Goliath mocks the young man coming to him with a staff.
- 45-50 ... David runs to meet Goliath and kills him by a slung stone.
- 51-53 ... David cuts Goliath's head off and Israel wins a great victory.
- 54-58 ... David humbly tells Saul he is merely the son of Jesse.



If the Bible says there were giants in Canaan, we totally believe it.

And there we saw the giants, the sons of Anak, which come of the giants: and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight.

Since the Bible says Joshua left giants in Gath, we know where Goliath came from.


There was none of the Anakims left in the land of the children of Israel: only in Gaza, in Gath, and in Ashdod, there remained.

Goliath was 9 feet and 9 inches tall, because he was six cubits and one span.

And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span.

How tall is 9 feet 9 inches?

The tallest man in recent history with provable height was Robert Wadlow, from Alton, Illinois living from 1918 to 1940.


Robert Wadlow

8 feet and 11 inches.

His father was 6 feet.

Robert weighed 500 with a BMI of 30.

His shoe size was 37. Shaq's is only 22.





What else is known of Goliath?

The Bible tells us several measures of his armor and weapons.

Goliath

9 feet and 9 inches.

He weighed 700 with a BMI of 35 (DE=34).

Coat of mail = 156 lbs.

Head of spear = 19 lbs.

All armor = 236 lbs.

Fact #8


Goliath fell forward on his face from David's stone in his forehead.

David took Goliath's head to Jerusalem, but he put Goliath's armor in his tent.





Fact #10

David and his men killed Goliath's relatives later in several other Philistine battles.

David and Men Killed Goliath's Four Relatives

- The Bible records the four in II Samuel 21:15-22 and I Chron 20:4-8.
- Ishbibenob almost killed David; Abishai killed him; they retired David.
- Saph was killed by Sibbechai the Hushathite (also called Mebunnai).
- Lahmi was killed by Elhanan of Bethlehem, also one of the 30.
- No Name was killed by Jonathan, David's nephew by Shimea.
- These special exploits of David's mighty men are twice in Bible.
- By "relatives" I hope to avoid distraction by sons and brothers.


Modern Versions Err in II Samuel 21:19


For example, the ESV contradicts I Samuel 17 and also I Chron 20:5.

And there was again war with the Philistines at Gob, and Elhanan the son of Jaare-oregim, the Bethlehemite, struck down Goliath the Gittite, the shaft of whose spear was like a weaver's beam (II Sam 21:19).

And there was again war with the Philistines, and Elhanan the son of Jair struck down Lahmi the brother of Goliath the Gittite, the shaft of whose spear was like a weaver's beam (I Chron 20:5).











Do you want to be like David?

Then we need to read this Bible story looking for lessons from its facts.

Be perfect in your little things, so God will give you big things to do.

- 17 And Jesse said unto David his son, Take now for thy brethren an ephah of this parched corn, and these ten loaves, and run to the camp to thy brethren;
- 18 And carry these ten cheeses unto the captain of their thousand, and look how thy brethren fare, and take their pledge.
 20 And David rose up early in the morning, and left the sheep with a keeper, and took, and went, as Jesse had commanded him; and he came to the trench, as the host was going forth to the fight, and shouted for the battle.

- 10 He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much.
- 11 If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?
- 12 And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own?

- 6 And it came to pass, when they were come, that he looked on Eliab, and said, Surely the LORD'S anointed is before him.
- 7 But the LORD said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the LORD seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart.
- 8 Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. And he said, Neither hath the LORD chosen this.

Never fear adversaries bigger, faster, stronger, or smarter than you.

- 4 And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span.
- 5 And he had an helmet of brass upon his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of brass.
- 6 And he had greaves of brass upon his legs, and a target of brass between his shoulders.
- 7 And the staff of his spear was like a weaver's beam; and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron: and one bearing a shield went before him.

And Saul said to David, Thou art not able to go against this Philistine to fight with him: for thou art but a youth, and he a man of war from his youth.

I Samuel 17:33

- 42 And when the Philistine looked about, and saw David, he disdained him: for he was but a youth, and ruddy, and of a fair countenance.
- 43 And the Philistine said unto David, Am I a dog, that thou comest to me with staves? And the Philistine cursed David by his gods.
- 44 And the Philistine said to David, Come to me, and I will give thy flesh unto the fowls of the air, and to the beasts of the field.

Lesson #7

Believe three witnesses of success – experience of Bible, others, you.

- And David said unto Saul, Thy servant kept his father's sheep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock:

 35 And I went out after him, and smote him, and delivered it out of his mouth: and when he arose against me, I caught him by his beard, and smote him, and slew him.
- Thy servant slew both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be as one of them, seeing he hath defied the armies of the living God.
- 37 David said moreover, The LORD that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine.

- 3 And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience;
- 4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope:
- 5 And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

Romans 5:3-5

For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.

Romans 15:4

- 1 We have heard with our ears, O God, our fathers have told us, what work thou didst in their days, in the times of old.

- 46 This day will the LORD deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee, and take thine head from thee; and I will give the carcases of the host of the Philistines this day unto the fowls of the air, and to the wild beasts of the earth; that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel.
- 47 And all this assembly shall know that the LORD saveth not with sword and spear: for the battle is the LORD'S, and he will give you into our hands.
