What is a ransom?

The price paid to free a person from captivity.

The price paid to remove a penalty or condemnation.

The price paid to restore a previous condition.

It is the price that must be paid to get a person out of trouble. Charles Lindbergh paid a huge ransom that did not work.

God paid His Son as ransom for us, and it worked eternal glory!

If there be a messenger with him, an interpreter, one among a thousand, to shew unto man his uprightness:

Then he is gracious unto him, and saith, Deliver him from going down to the pit:

I have found a ransom.

Job 33:23-24

Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Matthew 20:28

For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.

I Timothy 2:5-6

Ransom and Redeem are closely related.

They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches; None of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him: (For the **redemption** of their soul is precious, and it ceaseth for ever:) That he should still live for ever, and not see corruption.

Psalm 49:6-9

```
I will <u>ransom</u> them from the power of the grave;
I will <u>redeem</u> them from death:
O death, I will be thy plagues;
O grave, I will be thy destruction:
repentance shall be hid from mine eyes.
```

Hosea 13:14

They both mean paying a price to get something out of trouble.

Ransom = Usually a noun.

Redeem = Always a verb.

Ransom = the price paid.

Redeem = paying the price.

Focus!

God chose this word and concept to help describe what He did to save you from hell.

What does **redeem** mean?

To buy again. To buy back.

To buy back a thing or person formerly owned.

To make payment for a thing or person held or claimed by another.

To ransom, liberate, or free (a person) from bondage, captivity, or punishment.

To make a payment to buy a person out of a claim, judgment, or trouble.

The Bible has many examples and illustrations of <u>redeem</u>.

Girls sold to be concubines could be **redeemed**, but not sold to a foreign nation.

And if a man sell his daughter to be a maidservant, she shall not go out as the menservants do. If she please not her master, who hath betrothed her to himself, then shall he let her be redeemed: to sell her unto a strange nation he shall have no power, seeing he hath dealt deceitfully with her.

Exodus 21:7-8

If her master/husband did not want her, then her father, brother, or a better man could redeem her ... buying her freedom.

And whosoever lieth carnally with a woman, that is a bondmaid, betrothed to an husband, and not at all redeemed, nor freedom given her; she shall be scourged; they shall not be put to death, because she was not free.

Leviticus 19:20

Do not be distracted by the event, but rather learn how <u>redeem</u> and <u>freedom</u> go together, for <u>redeem</u> delivers a person from bondage.

When God <u>redeemed</u> Israel out of Egypt, He bought or purchased Israel by destroying Egypt.

Wherefore say unto the children of Israel,
I am the LORD, and I will bring you out
from under the burdens of the Egyptians,
and I will rid you out of their bondage,
and I will redeem you with a stretched out arm,
and with great judgments:

Exodus 6:6

Do ye thus requite the LORD,
O foolish people and unwise?
is not he thy father that hath **bought** thee?
hath he not made thee, and established thee?

Deuteronomy 32:6

Fear and dread shall fall upon them; by the greatness of thine arm they shall be as still as a stone; till thy people pass over, O LORD, till the people pass over, which thou hast <u>purchased</u>.

Exodus 15:16

Redeemed = Bought = Purchased

This is the most common use of <u>redeem</u>, <u>bought</u>, and <u>purchased</u> in the Bible ... God delivering Israel out of Egypt.

Israelites in Egypt were bondslaves with no rights from birth to death.

God ended their slavery under Pharaoh by redeeming them.

Redeemed = Delivered = Freed

But because the LORD loved you, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your fathers, hath the LORD brought you out with a mighty hand, and <u>redeemed</u> you out of the house of bondmen, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 7:8

And thou shalt remember that thou wast a bondman in the land of Egypt, and the LORD thy God <u>redeemed</u> thee: therefore I command thee this thing to day.

Deuteronomy 15:15

And what one nation in the earth is like thy people Israel, whom God went to <u>redeem</u> to be his own people, to make thee a name of greatness and terribleness, by driving out nations from before thy people, whom thou hast <u>redeemed</u> out of Egypt?

I Chronicles 17:21

He rebuked the Red sea also, and it was dried up: so he led them through the depths, as through the wilderness. And he saved them from the hand of him that hated them, and **redeemed** them from the hand of the enemy. And the waters covered their enemies: there was not one of them left.

Psalm 106:9-11

For I brought thee up out of the land of Egypt, and <u>redeemed</u> thee out of the house of servants; and I sent before thee Moses, Aaron, and Miriam.

Micah 6:4

Nothing yet about redeemed, bought, or purchased from sin and hell, just Egypt.



- 1 But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction....
- 3 Whose judgment now of a long time lingereth not, and their damnation slumbereth not....
- 13 Spots they are and blemishes, sporting themselves with their own deceivings while they feast with you....

- 5 They have corrupted themselves, their spot is not the spot of his children: they are a perverse and crooked generation.
- 6 Do ye thus requite the LORD, O foolish people and unwise? is not he thy father that hath bought thee? hath he not made thee, and established thee?

Deuteronomy 32:5-6

Il Peter 2:1 does not have persons
Jesus Christ bought at Calvary
that end up in hellfire.

II Peter 2:1 is Peter a Jew ripping reprobate Jews for denying their God from Egypt.

Rabbit caught.

Back to great examples of <u>redeem</u> in the Bible.

When God saved Israel out of Egypt, He killed Egypt's firstborn but saved Israel's firstborn alive.

Because of this glorious difference, all firstborn males were to be sacrificed to the LORD.

That thou shalt set apart unto the LORD all that openeth the matrix, and every firstling that cometh of a beast which thou hast; the males shall be the LORD'S.

Exodus 13:12

And it came to pass, when Pharaoh would hardly let us go, that the LORD slew all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both the firstborn of man, and the firstborn of beast: therefore I sacrifice to the LORD all that openeth the matrix, being males; but all the firstborn of my children I redeem.

Exodus 13:15

But because God did not want asses sacrificed, you either killed a lamb or the ass.





And every firstling of an ass thou shalt **redeem** with a lamb; and if thou wilt not redeem it, then thou shalt break his neck: and all the firstborn of man among thy children shalt thou redeem.

Exodus 13:13





Every thing that openeth the matrix in all flesh, which they bring unto the LORD, whether it be of men or beasts, shall be thine: nevertheless the firstborn of man shalt thou surely <u>redeem</u>, and the firstling of unclean beasts shalt thou <u>redeem</u>.

Numbers 18:15









Pastor, what about dogs?

They had to be redeemed by a lamb or killed just like the ass and all other unclean animals.

Pastor, what about Moses' rule in Deut 23:17-18 about not bringing the price of dog into the house of the LORD?

There shall be no whore of the daughters of Israel, nor a sodomite of the sons of Israel. Thou shalt not bring the hire of a whore, or the price of a dog, into the house of the LORD thy God for any vow: for even both these are abomination unto the LORD thy God.

Deuteronomy 23:17-18

Was that another rabbit?













Rabbit caught.

Back to great examples of <u>redeem</u> in the Bible.

If thy brother be waxen poor, and hath sold away some of his possession, and if any of his kin come to <u>redeem</u> it, then shall he **redeem** that which his brother sold.

Leviticus 25:25

And the kinsman said,
I cannot <u>redeem</u> it for myself,
lest I mar mine own inheritance:
<u>redeem</u> thou my right to thyself;
for I cannot <u>redeem</u> it.

Ruth 4:6

God chose to emphasize redeem.

Redeem = Bought = Purchased

Israel sang and shouted REDEEMED! on the shore of the Red Sea!





Did Jephthah kill his daughter and burn her as a burnt offering?

No, there were ways to redeem her, and perpetual virginity and tabernacle service fits the context.

Rabbit caught.

On to better and bigger uses by God of <u>redeem</u> in the Bible.

We are doomed slaves in the house of bondage – the devil's palace – with death and hell our future by God's claim against us.

We are all unclean asses by any measure and should have our necks broken.

We squandered God's gifts in Eden and sold our right to the tree of life to God's enemy.

Who will buy us out of the eternal trouble we got ourselves into with the perfectly holy God of heaven?

What payment will this holy God require for us to be free from sin and eternal judgment?

A Redeemer was found for us, and we should sing and shout REDEEMED!

better than Israel ever sang!

God did nothing for Israel and paid no price dear to Him for them in comparison to what He has done and paid for us.

God sent His only Son to be the redeeming Lamb to die ... so we unclean asses might live.

And she coming in that instant gave thanks likewise unto the Lord, and spake of him to all them that looked for redemption in Jerusalem.

Luke 2:38

Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world: But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

Galatians 4:3-7

Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree:

Galatians 3:13

For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God; Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus:

Romans 3:23-24

In whom we have redemption through his blood,

the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace; Wherein he hath abounded toward us in all wisdom and prudence;

Ephesians 1:7-8

Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us.

Hebrews 9:12

And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions that were under the first testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance.

Hebrews 9:15

Take heed therefore unto yourselves,
and to all the flock,
over the which the Holy Ghost
hath made you overseers,
to feed the church of God,
which he hath purchased with his own blood.

Acts 20:28

For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now. And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body.

Romans 8:22-23

In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise, Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.

Ephesians 1:13-14

But God will redeem my soul from the power of the grave: for he shall receive me. Selah.

Psalm 49:15

That no flesh should glory in his presence.

But of him are ye in Christ Jesus,
who of God is made unto us wisdom,
and righteousness,
and sanctification,
and redemption:

That, according as it is written, He that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord.

I Corinthians 1:29-31

And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth.

Revelation 5:9-10

What do we owe this Redeemer and the God that sent Him to die for our redemption?

Do ye thus requite the LORD,
O foolish people and unwise?
is not he thy father that hath bought thee?
hath he not made thee, and established thee?

Deuteronomy 32:6

For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

I Corinthians 6:20

And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear: Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

I Peter 1:17-19

Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.

Titus 2:11-14

Wherefore he saith, Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light. See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is.

Ephesians 5:14-17
