It is not in Romans 5:12-19.

Original sin is Adam's sin, guilt, and punishment legally imputed to us by God that is the first cause of death.

It is the lesson of Romans 5:12-19.

(For until the law sin was in the world:
but sin is not imputed when there is no law.
Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses,
even over them that had not sinned after
the similitude of Adam's transgression,
who is the figure of him that was to come.

Romans 5:13-14

**All men died during the 2500 years
between Adam and Moses for
Adam's sin, even without
any similar sin.**

Adam was a figure of Christ, not by sinning, but by the imputation of his sin to the account of others.

**Paul brought up the 2500 years death
