How About Priest and Melchizedek?

Melchizedek is once in Genesis 14 and Psalm 110.

Jesus is Priest or High Priest only in Hebrews (18).

Melchisedec is only in the N.T. in Hebrews (9 times).

Psalm 110:4 is used directly five times in Hebrews!

Psalm 110:5-7

Psalm 2 ... 3 hours and 4 minutes!

Hebrews 1:3b ... 1 hour & 48 minutes!

Psalm 110 deserves more than tonight!

The LORD said unto my Lord,
Sit thou at my right hand,
until I make thine enemies thy footstool.

Psalm 110:1

The LORD = Jehovah God ... My Lord = Jesus.

Incredible insider information from heaven's throne room!

God gave Jesus the throne of David after His ascension into heaven.

God promised to put all enemies under His feet from 70 A.D. to death itself!

**Jesus used this verse against the
Pharisees to prove they did not
know scriptures about Messiah.**

While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them,
Saying, What think ye of Christ? whose son is he?

They say unto him, The Son of David.

He saith unto them,

How then doth David in spirit call him Lord, saying,
The LORD said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand,
till I make thine enemies thy footstool?

If David then call him Lord, how is he his son?

When Was Psalm 8 Fulfilled?

What is man, that thou art mindful of him?
and the son of man, that thou visitest him?
For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels,
and hast crowned him with glory and honour.

Thou madest him to have dominion
over the works of thy hands;
thou hast put all things under his feet:

Psalm 8:4-6

Thou hast put all things in subjection under his feet.
For in that he put all in subjection under him,
he left nothing that is not put under him.
But now we see not yet all things put under him.
But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower
than the angels for the suffering of death,
crowned with glory and honour;
that he by the grace of God should
taste death for every man.

**Is Jesus Winning
Against His Enemies?**

And he that overcometh,
and keepeth my works unto the end,
to him will I give power over the nations:
And he shall rule them with a rod of iron;
as the vessels of a potter shall they be broken to shivers:
even as I received of my Father.

Revelation 2:26-27

Then cometh the end, when he shall have
delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father;
when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.
For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet.
The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death.

Almighty God gave Jesus mighty power from Zion.

Zion was an old name for Jerusalem, the kingdom capital.

This verse has Jesus against His enemies, the next is for His people.

The gates of hell could not resist gospel news that Jesus was the Son of God!

And Simon Peter answered and said,
Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.
And Jesus answered and said unto him,
Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona:
for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee,
but my Father which is in heaven.
And I say also unto thee,
That thou art Peter, and upon this rock
I will build my church; and the gates of hell
shall not prevail against it.

Matthew 16:16-18

And when they found them not,
they drew Jason and certain brethren
unto the rulers of the city, crying,
These that have turned the world
upside down are come hither also;
Whom Jason hath received:
and these all do contrary to the
decrees of Caesar, saying that
there is another king, one Jesus.

Acts 17:6-7

But ye are come unto mount Sion,
and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem,
and to an innumerable company of angels,
To the general assembly and church of the firstborn,

Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power,
in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning:

Psalm 110:3

Thy people and power = Christ's, not God's (110:2).

Holiness is the beautifying attribute of true worship of God.

Womb of the morning = metaphor for a sunrise bringing new light.

Dew = a metaphor for blessings of prosperity like rain (Deut 32:2; Job 29:19).

Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power,
in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning:

Psalm 110:3

The setting is fixed – our Lord's coronation (1:1).

He had before ascending declared His power (Matt 28:18).

He promised power and sent power at Pentecost (Acts 1:8; 2:33-35).

Many were willing to follow Jesus (Acts 2:37-41; 4:4; 6:7; 9:6,31; 12:24; 13:43; etc.).

And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying,
All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

Go ye therefore, and teach all nations,
baptizing them in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

Matthew 28:18-19

Therefore being by the right hand of God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this, which ye now see and hear.

For David is not ascended into the heavens:
but he saith himself, The LORD said unto my Lord,
Sit thou on my right hand, Until I make thy foes thy footstool.

Acts 2:33-35

And the word of God increased;
and the number of the disciples
multiplied in Jerusalem greatly;
and a great company of the priests
were obedient to the faith.

Acts 6:7

And he trembling and astonished said,

Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?

And the Lord said unto him, Arise, and go into the city,
and it shall be told thee what thou must do.

Acts 9:6

**The next phrase is considered the
most obscure words in all the
book of Psalms.**

Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power,
in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning:
thou hast the dew of thy youth.

Psalm 110:3

The setting is fixed – glorious gospel success.

He shined from perfect beauty of Zion (Ps 50:1-6; 89:35-37).

Sun of righteousness ended darkness (Is 12:6; 59:19; Mal 4:2; II Cor 4:6).

Light Himself burst forth for holy worship (Jn 4:23; Rev 1:5-6; Heb 7:26; I Pet 2:4-9).

Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power,
in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning:
thou hast the dew of thy youth.

Psalm 110:3

It is personal singular for Jesus, not His people.

He was glorified and not corrupted (Ps 16:8-11; Acts 2:24-28).

He declared Himself that He was alive forevermore (Rev 1:18; Heb 7:16).

Jesus has youthful vitality with refreshing strength for us (Psalm 45:1-3; 133:3).

Isn't this enough?

**Jesus our glorious King lives forever
over His and our enemies and leads
us in perfect new and holy worship.**

No! It is not enough!

Jesus is our Lord ... AND OUR SAVIOR!

No! It is not enough!

**Jesus is also our high priest forever,
after a new order of priesthood,
and called by Jehovah's oath!**

Hallelujah!

Amen!

The LORD hath sworn, and will not repent,
Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.

Psalm 110:4

The LORD = Jehovah ... Thou = Jesus.

I AM THAT I AM has guaranteed you His priest forever.

He did not descend from Levi or Aaron ... but Judah and David!

Paul in Hebrews 7 proves Jesus' superior priesthood by inspired reasoning.

For this Melchisedec, king of Salem, priest of the most high God,
who met Abraham returning from the slaughter of the kings,
and blessed him;

To whom also Abraham gave a tenth part of all;
first being by interpretation King of righteousness,
and after that also King of Salem, which is, King of peace;
Without father, without mother, without descent,
having neither beginning of days, nor end of life;
but made like unto the Son of God;
abideth a priest continually.

Hebrews 7:1-3

Now of the things which we have spoken this is the sum:

We have such an high priest,
who is set on the right hand of the
throne of the Majesty in the heavens;
A minister of the sanctuary,
and of the true tabernacle,
which the Lord pitched, and not man.

Hebrews 8:1-2

Hallelujah!

The Mystery of Malkiy-Tsedeq

You need a priest – a very good one. Without a priest you cannot go to heaven. The Jews trusted Levitical priests from Aaron. But David wrote in Psalm 110:4 that God would make Messiah a far better priest. Paul explained it all in Hebrews 7 by precious similarities of Jesus to Melchisedec. God swore that Jesus would be a priest forever after the order of Melchisedec.



The Lord at thy right hand
shall strike through kings
in the day of his wrath.

Psalm 110:5

The Lord = Jesus ... He is at God's right hand.

As Psalm 2 warned, kings should kiss the Son of God.

What happened to Herod Agrippa I, who killed James for the Jews?

Jesus is King of kings, has been ruling for 2000 yrs., and comes in wrath soon.

These shall make war with the Lamb,
and the Lamb shall overcome them:
for he is Lord of lords, and King of kings:
and they that are with him are called, and chosen, and faithful.

Revelation 17:14

He shall judge among the heathen,
he shall fill the places with the dead bodies;
he shall wound the heads over many countries.

Psalm 110:6

This is our militaristic Lord Jesus Christ!

What happened to the Jews for crucifying Him earlier?

What happened to pagan and papal Rome for their abominations?

What will happen when all the nations follow Satan against all the saints?

He shall drink of the brook in the way:
therefore shall he lift up the head.

Psalm 110:7

This is our victorious Lord Jesus Christ!

He is in full control and can safely stop for refreshment.

He is totally successful in all His conflicts and can rejoice in them.

He will then deliver up the kingdom to God after vanquishing all His enemies.

Then cometh the end, when he shall have
delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father;
when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.
For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet.
The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death.
