Let us sing a Bible chorus taken  
from David's Psalms.

I will sing of the mercies of the LORD for ever: with my mouth will  
I make known thy faithfulness to all generations.

Psalm 89:1

A true apostolic church will

We know this chorus well.  
We have sung it many times.  
Many of us learned it as children.

Do we sing the good words of  
*mercies ... faithfulness*  
without knowing what God  
specifically intended by them?

Some just form the words  
melodically without grasping  
or appreciating them at all.

Others think of daily mercies and faithfulness like ... sunshine, food, health, safety, jobs, forgiveness, truth, church, promises, etc.

Both ways of singing  
the verse are wrong.
